



Changes to the Georgia Health Advantage (HMO I-SNP) 2023 Annual Notice of Change

This is important information on changes in your Georgia Health Advantage H8093-001 coverage.

We previously sent you the Annual Notice of Change (ANOC) which provides information about your coverage as an enrollee in our plan. This notice is to let you know there were errors in your ANOC. Section 1.4, Medicare Part B Prescription Drugs changes effective April 1, 2023 and July 1, 2023, were inadvertently omitted from Page 8	In-Network: You pay 20% of the cost for Medicare covered Part B Drugs.	Beginning April 1, 2023: In-Network: From 0% up to 20% of the cost for Medicare covered Part B Drugs. Beginning July 1, 2023, you won't pay more than \$35 for a one-month supply of each insulin product covered by our plan, no matter what cost-sharing tier it's on, even if you haven't paid your deductible.	In 2023, your coinsurance may decrease for certain Medicare Part B covered drugs. In 2023, you will most likely pay less money for your monthly insulin supply, compared to 2022.
